Untangling “Blended Families”:
Working with Clients in Stepfamily Relationships

- understand the major challenges stepfamily structure creates for adults and children and their relationships with each other.
- describe specific strategies that help meet the challenges of stepfamily “architecture”.
- recognize what adults can do to support children’s adjustment in a stepfamily.
- differentiate between the parenting and stepparenting role.

The Program

The complex relationships in what is commonly (and inaccurately) referred to as the “Blended Family” typically involve stunningly frequent attachment breaks, “resistant” or unhappy children, and conflicting parenting styles, not to mention differing values on everything from whether Grape Nuts is a food to the appropriate cost of a new pair of sneakers. While these difficulties routinely present in the early stages, complications may be seen many years down the road.

These relationships are frequently intense and challenging. What works is often not intuitive. Bloggers, trade book writers, and facebookers along with therapists have produced a flood of well meaning advice, much of it misleading and even destructive.

This workshop will examine the five major challenges created by “stepfamily architecture”. Participants will learn how to help stepfamilies meet these challenges, how adults can help children handle divisive forces and emotional binds that characterize stepfamilies, how successful stepparenting differs from primary parenting, and review strategies for coexisting amicably with an ex-spouse. Whether you work with adults or children, with individuals, couples, or families, you will leave with immediately applicable tools to meet these challenges.
