John D. Harris, known as “Big Red” or “Double Trouble,” is training daily for his dream of making it big in Mixed Martial Arts (MMA). However, his journey began years ago. From his arrival at Kurn Hattin Homes for Children when he was eight years old, he found a positive outlet for his energy.

“Kurn Hattin gave me the chance to explore martial arts,” John says. “They supported me, driving me to my lessons, helping me to find a constructive outlet for my energy, and encouraging me along the way.” The discipline, focus, and respect he learned as a child now guide him in the challenging world of MMA—a sport that blends boxing, wrestling, judo, and more.

After leaving Kurn Hattin in 2012, John continued to excel as an athlete at Bellows Falls Union High School, competing in wrestling and Golden Gloves boxing. These experiences helped him take the next steps toward MMA. His first heavyweight MMA match, against a former NFL player, was a learning experience. “I didn’t win, but I put on a good show,” John says. “As I was driving home, I was convinced this is where I belong.”

John’s partner, Caroline Donovan-Atwood, helps him balance his intense training schedule, her work at the Brattleboro Food Co-op, and raising John’s daughter, Luna. Fighting as an amateur, he is honing his skills with hopes of soon moving to the semi-pro level and eventually fighting professionally in the Flex Fight Series.

“I was a kid from nowhere with nothing, but with the support and encouragement I received at Kurn Hattin, I believe that I can go anywhere and become something,” John says. For him, success isn’t about money. “Now, I believe true success is about happiness, feeling supported, and having options in life. If you have those things, then you’ve succeeded.”

Adversity has revealed John’s strength and determination, and he’s just getting started.



A Sound Role Model

Pete Keppler never imagined his career path would lead to an Emmy Award, but in 2021, it became a reality.

As part of Kurn Hattin’s Career Awareness Program (CAP), renowned audio engineer and music producer Pete Keppler visited campus to share his journey spanning 44 years in the music industry.

On stage in the Higbie Auditorium, Pete spoke openly about challenges in his life, including losing his father to alcoholism at age seven. “The secrets in my life shaped my personality. I started getting into trouble in school, partly because I didn’t have an adult I felt I could trust. Kurn Hattin is incredible. You kids have trusting adults you can talk to about anything. I wish I’d had that when I was your age.”

As a teen, Pete dreamed of being a drummer in a rock band but discovered his true talent lay in producing, recording, and mixing music. He worked hard, took every

job he could, and built valuable industry connections.

Those connections led to years with music legends like David Bowie and Bonnie Raitt. In 2020, Pete mixed music for *American Utopia*, a Spike Lee film based on David Byrne’s Broadway show, earning him an Emmy for Creative Arts in Mixing.

Pete also served as the sound engineer for Katy Perry’s 2015 Super Bowl halftime show, a fact which thrilled the students when they learned of it. However, he cautioned, “Fame in itself is not a natural state and can be quite empty. It seems exciting, but it’s not something I would encourage you to aspire to.”

Today, Pete creates music in a mobile studio he built himself. “I feel grateful to share my story with people who have their whole lives ahead of them. I want them to know it’s possible to come from almost anywhere and succeed in life,” he says.

Ben Weiner Takes Gaming to the Next Level

Encouraging kids to play online games in the classroom? Absolutely. Kurn Hattin's SmartLab Facilitator, Ben Weiner, is serious about making learning fun through games. He shared this passion at the SmartLab Annual Conference in Denver, CO, a three-day event with hundreds of attendees and over 50 presenters. Judging by the feedback, Ben's workshop was a conference highlight.

"As technology continues to advance, games inevitably become more complex, but many of the dynamics at work in social and solitary play are as old as humanity itself," Ben says. "Learning with games is not only fun, it involves a range of concepts such as incentives and motivation, player agency, moderating the play space, depth of engagement and more, all of which contribute to making the learning stick."

A self-described proud hyper-generalist, Ben facilitates Kurn Hattin's SmartLab, a STEAM classroom (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) developed by Creative Learning Systems. The first of its kind in New England, the SmartLab offers students opportunities to explore subjects through kit-led challenges and serves as a makerspace where arts, crafts, and designs come to life.

Ben loves exploring SmartLab offerings alongside students and solving problems together. Yes, that includes playing games on a regular basis.

The archer must stay focused on the target, resisting the urge to let their eyes wander. Much like in life, success will rely on follow-through and unwavering focus to truly hit the mark.

While our children often begin with little music background, in a short time they are reading music, playing instruments, and singing songs. Soon, they're performing at morning meetings, auditioning for solos, and preparing for their first concert.

Players usually start with the clarinet or trumpet—instruments that offer the greatest success with the least frustration. Once ready, they join the beginning band. Being part of a choir or band is life changing, fostering inclusion, belonging, and strong friendships while boosting self-esteem.

Performing for an audience brings growth in all areas. Music provides our children with opportunity and joy, helping them develop in profound ways. Watching a shy child transform into a confident performer, both on and off the stage, is truly inspirational.

Many of our children carry the joy of singing and playing an instrument—or several—throughout their lives.
